

SHORT-HAUL: MONET AND THE IMPRESSIONIST CITYSCAPE, BERLIN, UNTIL 26 JANUARY, 2025

Berlin's Alte Nationalgalerie is hosting an exhibition dedicated to Claude Monet's three earliest paintings of Paris in 1867. Saint Germain l'Auxerrois, Jardin de l'Infante and the Quai du Louvre (pictured) are considered the first Impressionist cityscapes. The exhibition also investigates the mark Monet had on fellow Impressionist painters' depictions of the modern city – from Gustave Caillebotte to Henri Matisse. Tickets from £14.
